Rotary Bike Project

Have you heard about the Rotary Bike project? If you haven't go to www.worldbicyclerelief.org for information about this amazing project.

Clubs in Rotary District 6000 has raised over \$70,000 since July 1 that has purchased about 470 bikes. 33 clubs of the 66 in our district have participated and many of the remaining clubs are making plans to support the project.

The World Bike Relief (WBR) sends heavy-duty utilitarian bikes to developing countries to allow students and teachers to get to school, health care workers to get to the rural areas and for farmers to get their produce to the market. Each bike can change the economic family tree for an average of 5 people. A bike is oftentimes the single most valuable asset a family owns. They are called Buffalo Bikes and cost \$147 per bike, delivered in a developing country.
